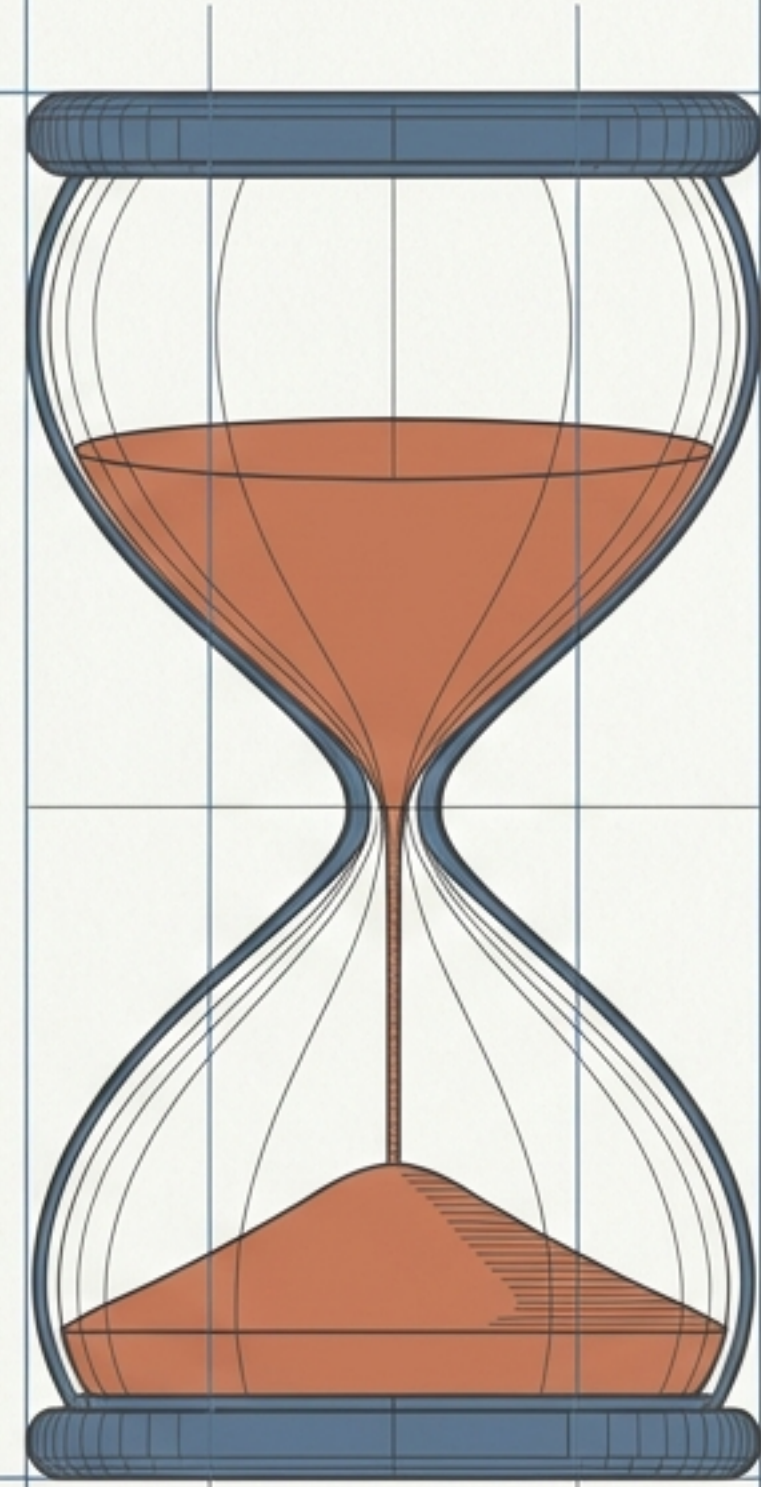

Rising from the Ashes

The Necessity of Design

The early 20th century was defined by the failure of the League of Nations and the catastrophe of World War II. The use of nuclear weapons created a new imperative: destructive wars must be stopped as a collective responsibility.



The Catalyst: A permanent mechanism was required to prevent total annihilation.

The Mission



Establish and maintain international peace.



Foster friendly relations among nations.



Safeguard human rights and freedom.



Enhance international economic cooperation.

The Code of Conduct

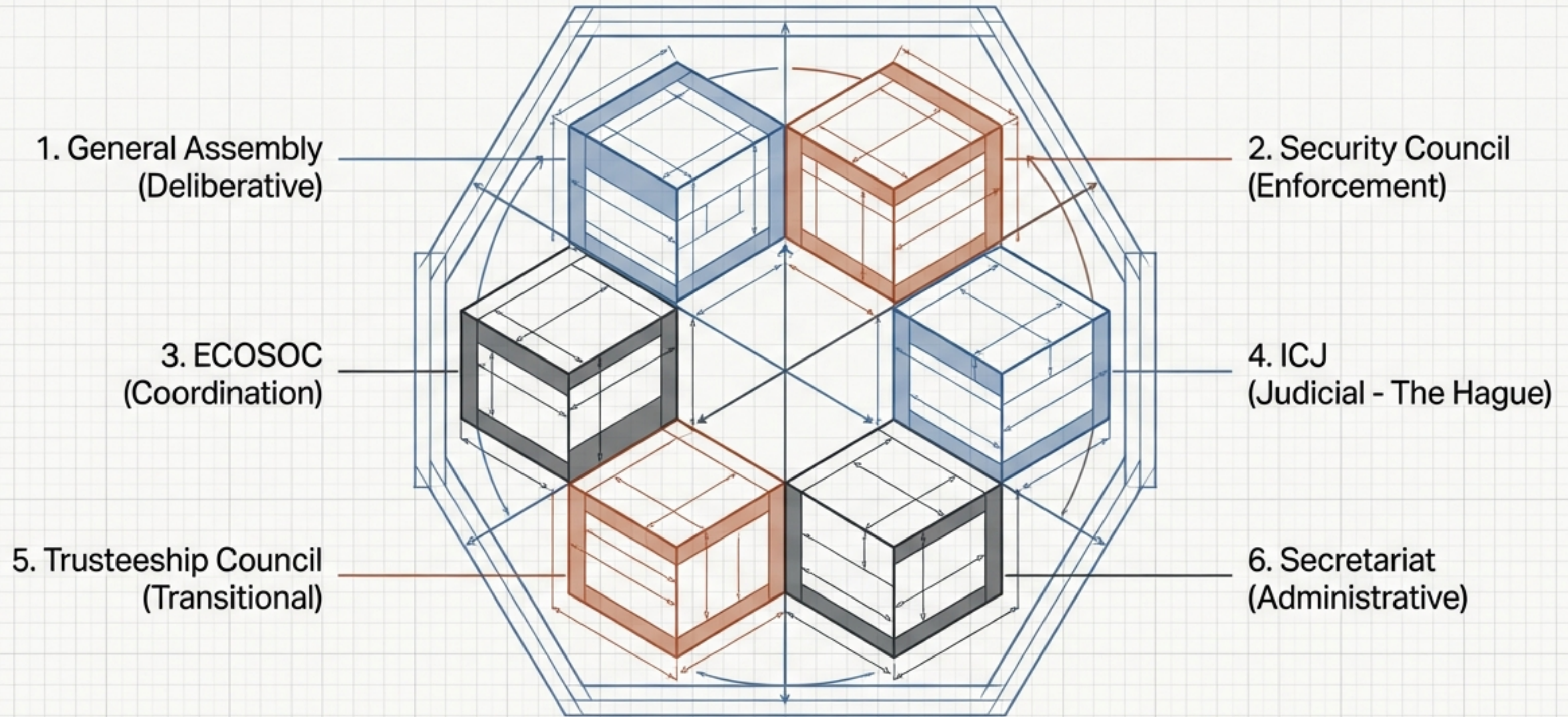
1. Sovereign Equality: Same status for all nations, regardless of size or power.

2. Respect: Honoring the freedom and geographical unity of others.

3. Non-Aggression: Duty-bound to abide by international law; no attacks.

4. Peaceful Resolution: All disputes must be solved by peaceful means.

The Six Pillars of the United Nations



All organs are headquartered in New York, USA, except the International Court of Justice.



General Assembly: The Platform for the World

Composition

Charcoal Charter

- All member countries represented.
- The Equality Rule applies: Rich or poor, big or small, every nation has the same status.

Operations

Charcoal Charter

Sessions: September to December annually.

Decisions: Majority vote (Resolutions).
Note: Does not make laws, but sets global policy.

Key Duties

Charcoal Charter

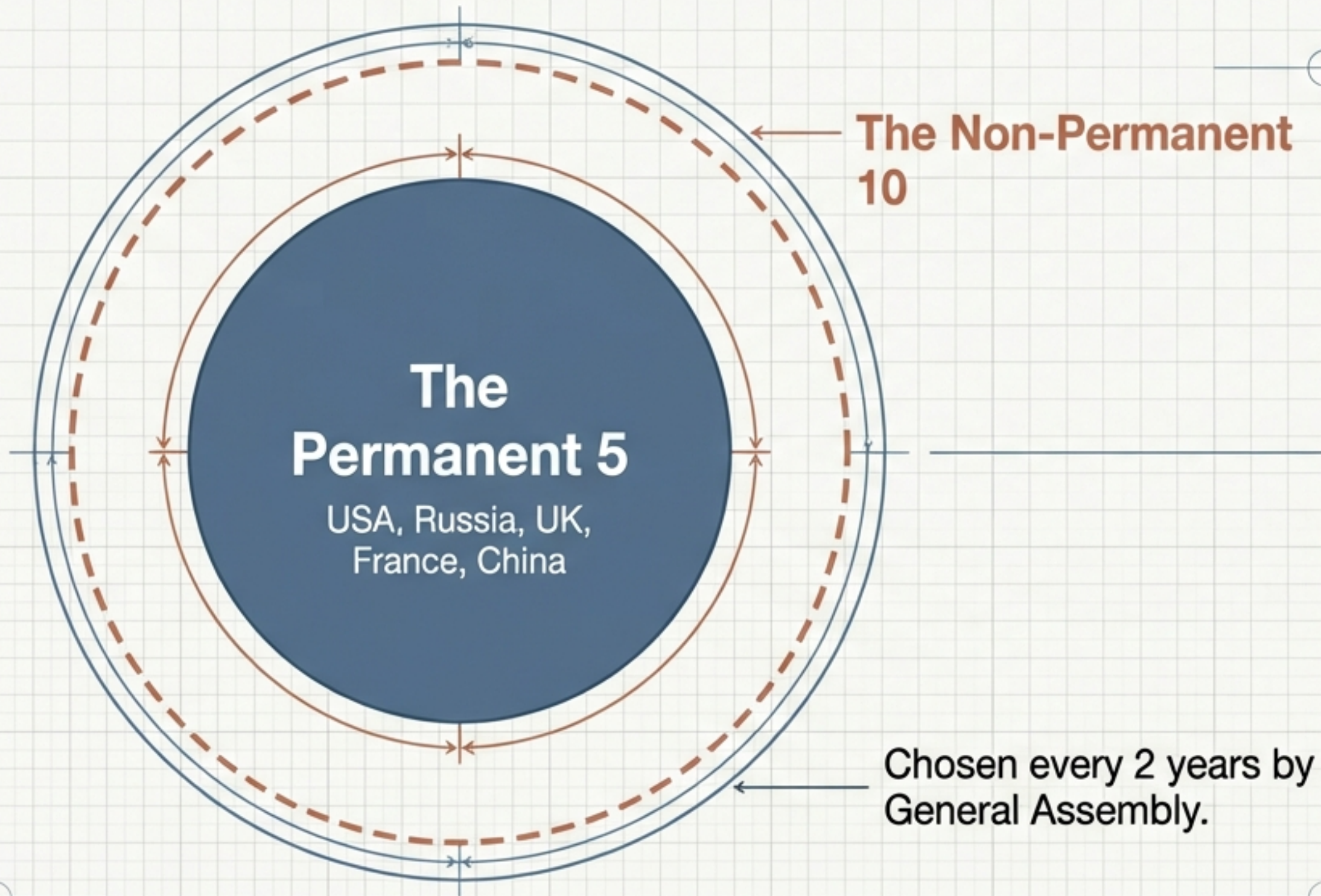
Elects non-permanent Security Council members.

Appoints Secretary-General & ICJ judges.

Passes the annual budget.

Security Council: Maintaining International Order

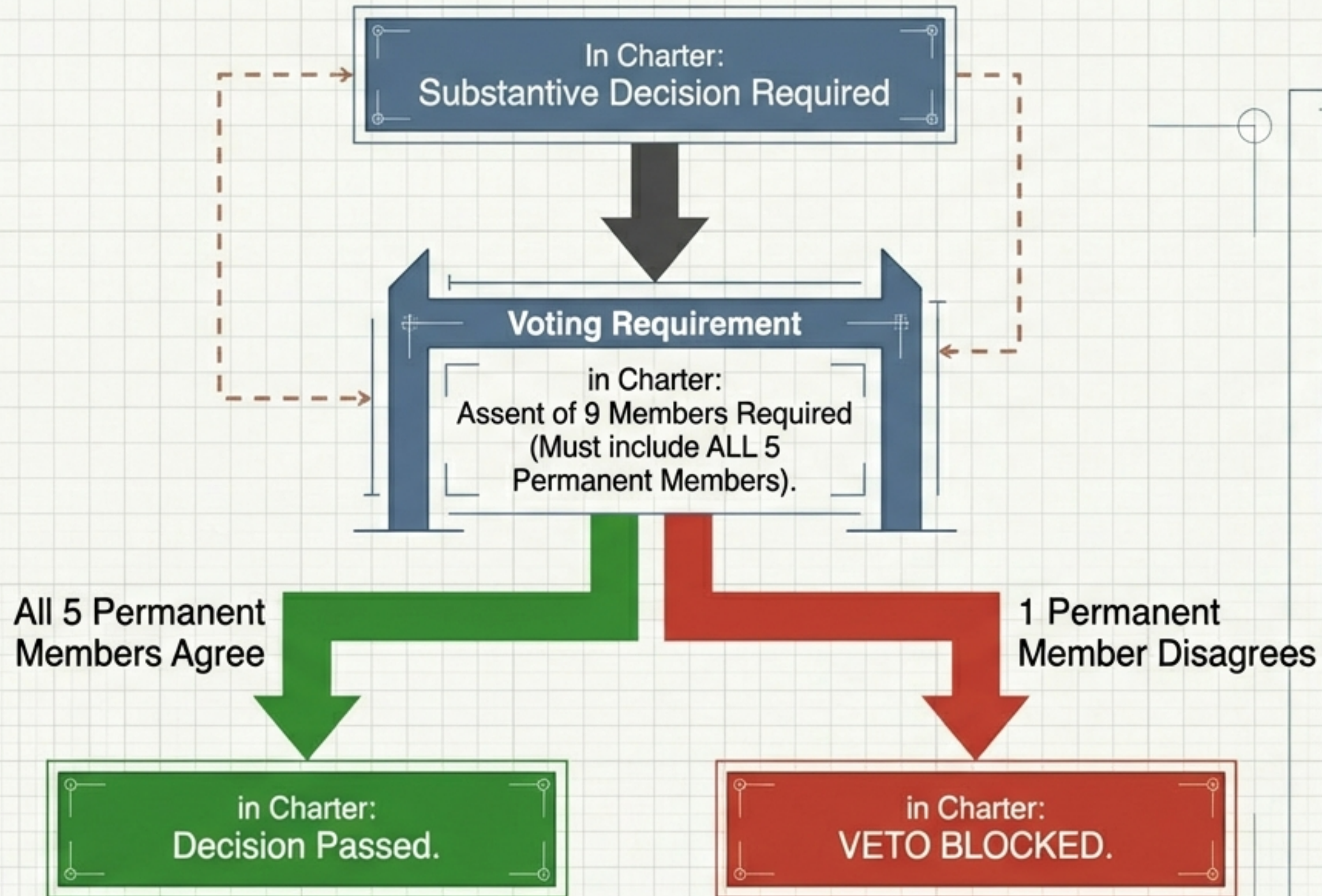
Primary Responsibility: Maintenance of peace and security.



Powers

- Prepare arms control policies.
- Suggest conflict resolution (sanctions, military action).
- Appoint ICJ judges and Secretary-General (Joint role).

The Mechanism of the Veto



Current Context:

- Calls for democratic reform are growing.
- India is currently advocating for permanent membership.

Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC)

Primary Function: Coordinating global economic and social policies.

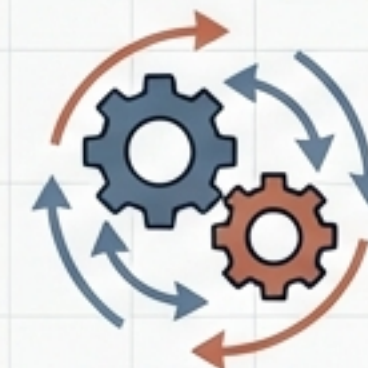

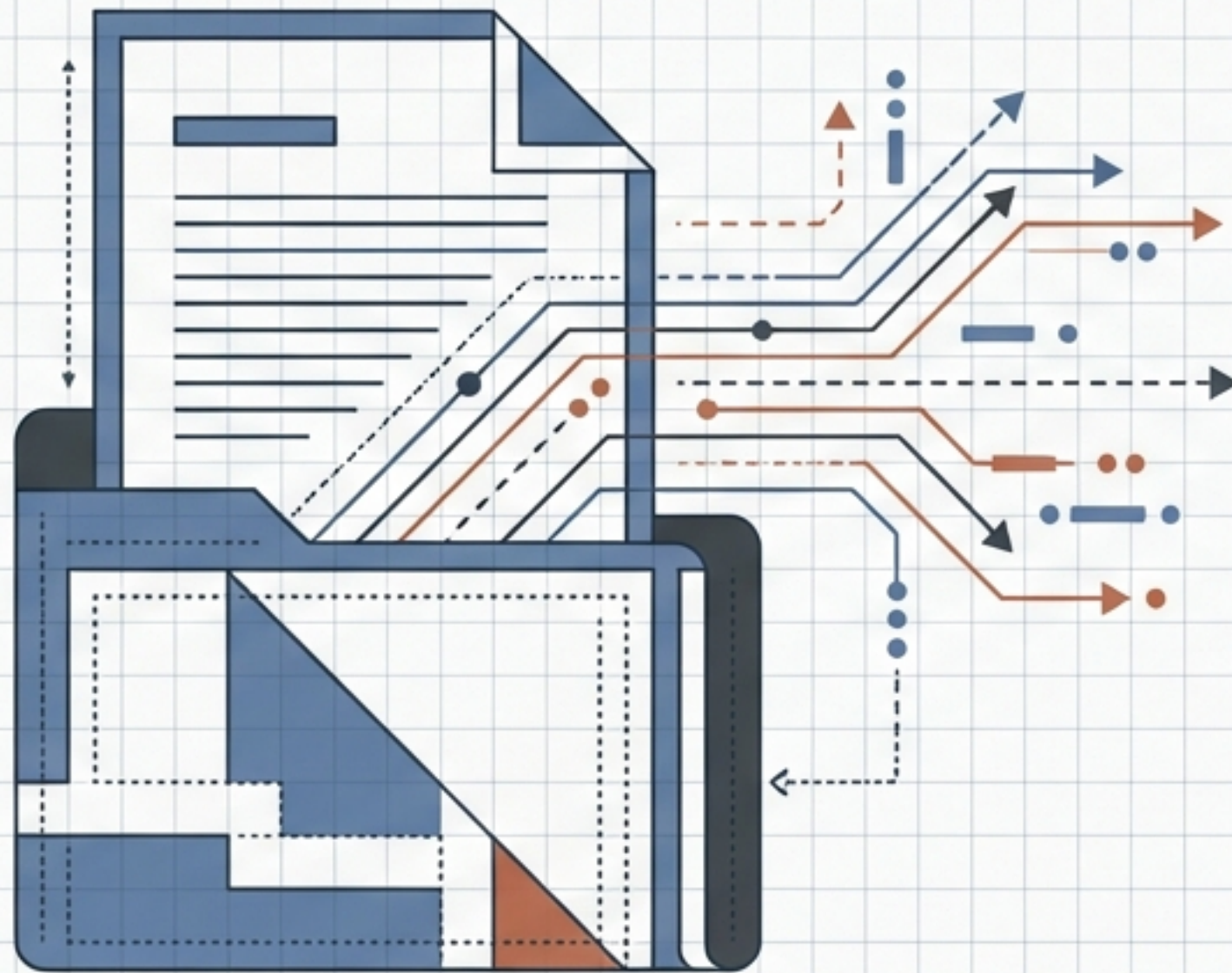

The Secretariat: The Administrative Engine



Role: Daily administrative tasks and information management.

Leadership: The Secretary-General.

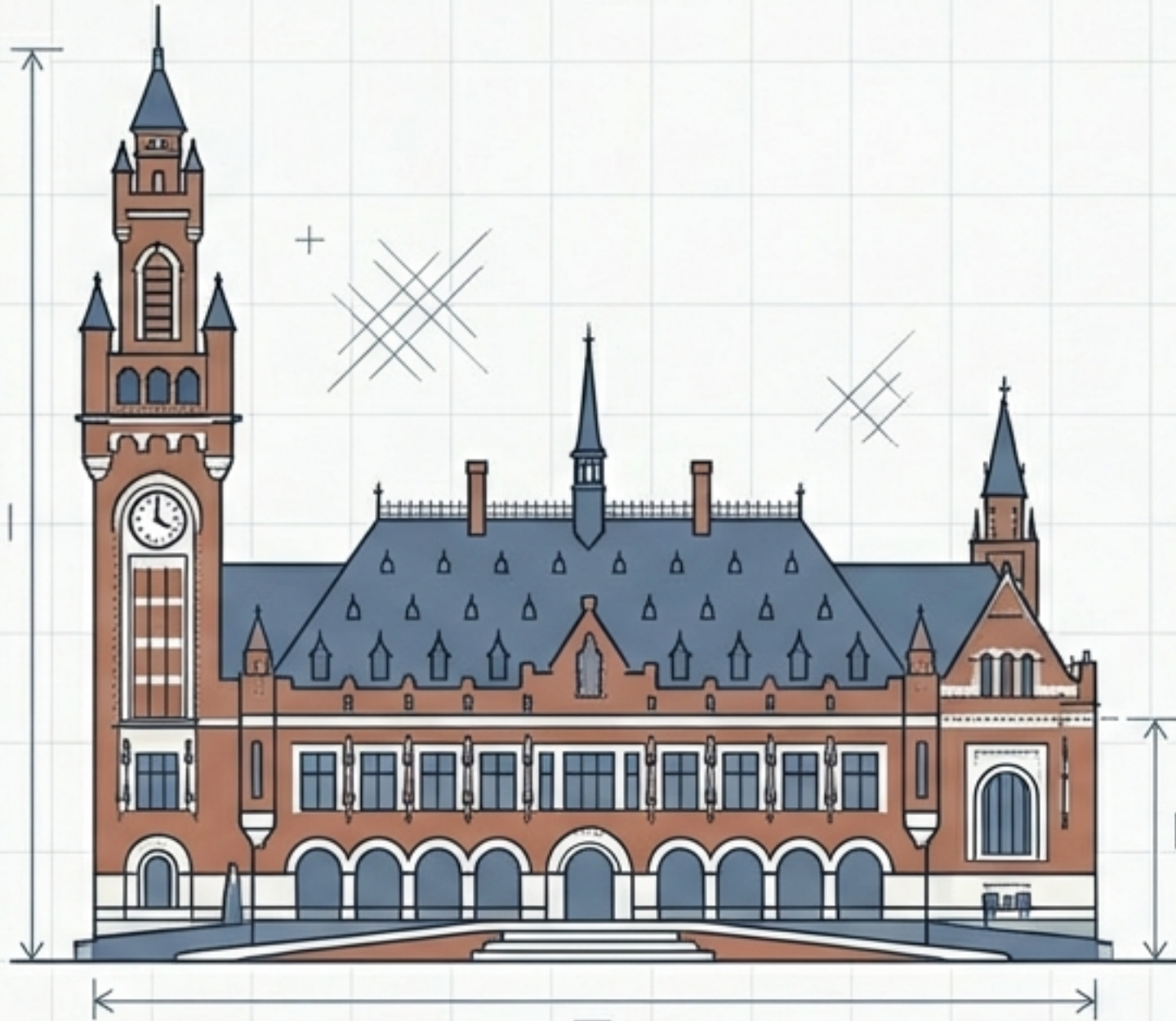
- Selected by General Assembly & Security Council.
- Tenure: 5 Years.

Key Functions:

- Organizing meetings for Assembly & Security Council.
- Compiling and supplying information to media.
- Calling international conferences (Climate, Human Rights).

Official Languages: English, French, Russian, Spanish, Chinese, Arabic.

International Court of Justice (ICJ)



Location: The Hague, Netherlands.

Composition: 15 Judges (9-year tenure).
Chosen by General Assembly and Security Council.

Functions:

1. Settle disputes between member nations.
2. Provide authentic interpretations of international law.
3. Advise UN bodies on legal issues.

Distinction: The International Criminal Court (ICC) is a separate tribunal for prosecuting individuals for war crimes.

Trusteeship Council: A Completed Mission



Original Purpose: Helvetica Now
To oversee “Trust Territories” and guide them
from colonial rule to independence.

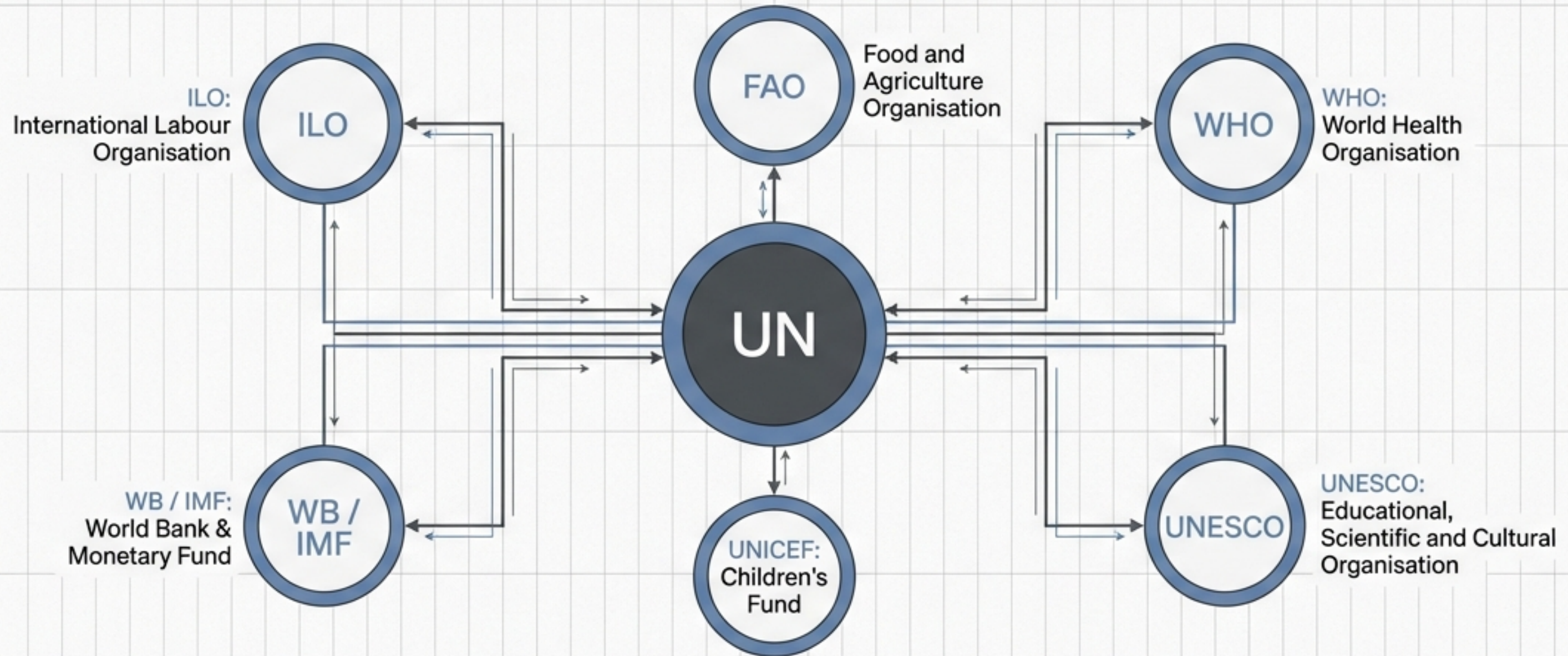
Status: Suspended Operation.

The Milestone: Work effectively ended on
November 1, 1994, when Palau gained
independence.

Significance: Demonstrates the UN’s ability
ability to evolve and fulfill mandates. No
trust territories remain.

Specialized Agencies: The System in Action

IMPACT: Measures against malnutrition in India.



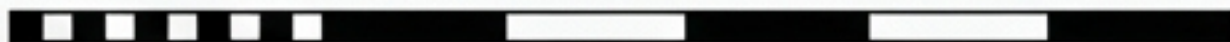

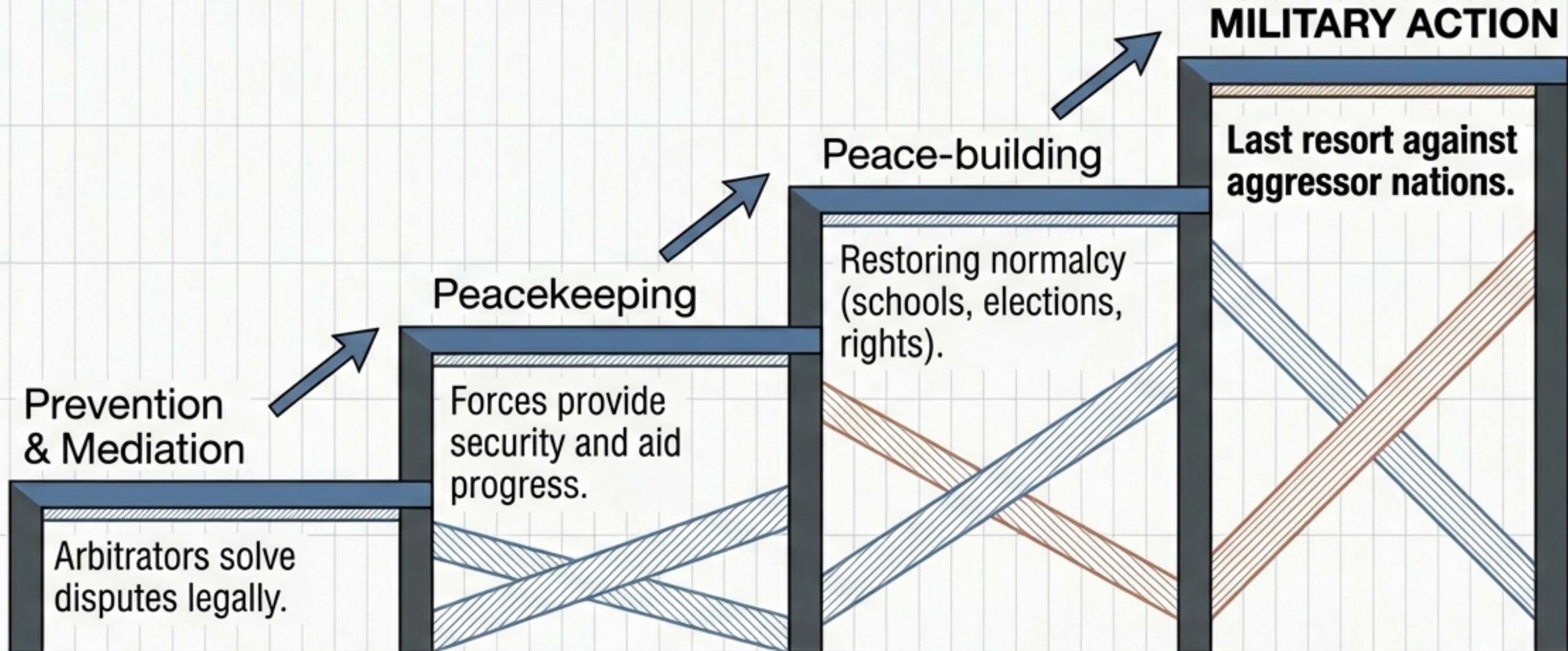
